CORRECTIONS, EXPRESSIONS OF CONCERN, AND RETRACTIONS

JBUON publishes post-publication notices, according to JBUON policies, publication criteria, editorial standards, and also the ICMJE and COPE guidelines.

For authors and readers:

- Send an email to us with the relevant details (<u>editorial office@jbuon.com</u>), if your publication might need a correction;
- 2) JBUON welcomes the readers to notify us any concern pertaining to the integrity, validity, or reliability of a published JBUON article.

<u>CORRECTIONS</u>: Errors that impact an article's interpretation or indexing.

Post-publication corrections can be accepted only if all of the following criteria have been met:

[1] The errors impact the main contents or understanding of the article.

[2] The article's overall results and conclusions are upheld.

[3] There are no concerns about the integrity or reliability of the reported work.

EXPRESSIONS OF CONCERN (EOCS): Concerns about compliance with journal standards and policies

Expressions of Concern (EOCs) are notices published at editors' discretion to alert readers of serious concerns about published work. JBUON may notify the authors of the affected article before publishing an EOC, but we do not require the authors' approval or agreement. The editor may seek to publish data or other materials received from the authors as supporting files with an EOC; in such cases, authors are consulted and can elect not to have their files/materials published.

JBUON

<u>RETRACTION NOTICES</u>: Concerns that have implications for the integrity, reliability, and/or validity of published JBUON articles.

According to COPE's Retraction Guidelines, retraction is a mechanism for correcting the literature and notifying readers of major concerns about the integrity, validity, or reliability of an article. JBUON will retract an article if the editors determine that issues that are not resolved in our discussions with the authors warrant retraction per COPE guidance. JBUON may also retract an article due to the image or data concerns.

JBUON publishes a retraction notice with the reason(s) for the retraction. The original JBUON article PDF is watermarked with red 'RETRACTED'. All the authors are informed before completing a retraction.
